I have a basic HTML document example shown here.



I felt it important to implement this suggestion as it would help facilitate people's understanding of how to use the app by giving them more immediate access to the app layout and purpose.






BEFORE AFTER

Changed the verbiage in the onboarding sequence for readability and UI consistency such as dropping the word "hamburger" from the drop down menu description.


